## PARTIAL SCHOLARSHIP TO NORTHWEST CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL (\$2,500)

The Reverend John T. Shugrue dedicated the last twenty-two years of his priesthood to serving the parish of the Church of St. Peter Claver. As its first pastor, he led his parishioners in prayer and in increasing their love for God.

Particularly important to Father Shugrue were young people, those of St. Peter Claver and the hundreds of others he came to know and influence during the years he served at St. Joseph Cathedral School, St. Thomas Aquinas High School and South Catholic High School.

Father Shugrue would have protested any memorial in his name, such was his humility. However, parishioners of the Church of St. Peter Claver believe that a scholarship fund, which would assist young people in pursuing their Catholic education at Northwest Catholic High School, is a fitting tribute to this gentle man. It is their way of expressing their continuing affection for their former pastor and of acknowledging his love of children.

In 2006, the scholarship fund was increased with a bequest from the estate of Mary G. Shugrue, the sister of the Rev. Shugrue. She, too, dedicated herself to working for the Catholic Church. For years she served as secretary to Bishop Daniel Riley of the Norwich diocese. In 2011, gifts in memory of Rev. Shugrue's brother, James F. Shugrue, were directed to the scholarship fund, as they were again in 2015 when another brother, Joseph N. Shugrue, passed away. This is in keeping with the wishes of the Shugrue family that Rev. Shugrue and his deceased family members be remembered for the great value they placed on Catholic education.

The scholarship will be awarded to a ninth-grade student on the basis of character, leadership qualities, academic ability, achievements, and financial need. The guidelines are:

- The recipient must be **Catholic** and actively involved in his/her parish.
- The recipient need not be a member of the St. Peter Claver Parish, but, if he/she is and all things are equal, preference will be given to the member of the parish.
- To retain the scholarship from year to year, the student must maintain an expected level of academic achievement, be involved in the life of the school, and uphold its standard of conduct
- In the event that the student should leave Northwest Catholic High School, the administrators may use their discretion in applying the scholarship to another student who meets the criteria.
- The parents must complete the FACTS tuition assistance application. If their child is selected as a recipient, they must complete the FACTS application annually.
